Grade Requirements and Upper Division Hours:

Communication majors must earn a grade of C or better in all Communication classes <u>including</u> CO Upper Division electives.

Upper Division classes are labeled at the 3000-4000 level. Students are required to take 31 upper division hours in the College of Arts & Sciences. The Broadcast & Digital Journalism curriculum provides 31 hours of upper division credit. If needed, additional hours may be earned by taking A&S upper division courses as Humanities electives, Social Science electives and/or general electives.
