Students with an ACT English sub-score of 28+ may take Accelerated English Composition II and with a grade of "C" or better earn credit for both English Composition classes.

Students with an 18 or lower on the Math section of the ACT must first take MA 0103 Intermediate Algebra. The MSU Math Department requires a C or better in Math in Your World or College Algebra to enroll in a higher-level math. Students with an ACT Math sub-score of 24+ may qualify to take one math: Trigonometry/Statistics with credit for MA 1313 or Calculus (MA 1613 or 1713).
