However, to reach 121 hours total, Public Relations students typically must earn 16-19 hours of general elective credit. The first two levels of a foreign language will count as six of these hours. Grade Requirements and Upper Division Hours:

Communication majors must earn a grade of C or better in all Communication classes including CO Upper Division electives.

Upper Division classes are labeled at the 3000-4000 level. Students are required to take 31 upper division hours in the College of Arts & Sciences. The Public Relations curriculum provides 33 hours of upper division credit. If needed, additional hours may be earned by taking A&S upper division courses as Humanities electives, Social Science electives and/or general electives.
